### Haraburda Receives National and State Engineering Honors

Indianapolis, Ind. (June 18, 2013) – The National Society of Professional Engineers (NSPE) named Scott S. Haraburda, PhD, PE, a Fellow member of their society in recognition of his outstanding engineering leadership and service support to the community.

Established in 2000, the NSPE Fellows program recognizes professional engineers who provide long-term service at the chapter, state, and national levels of the Society, as well as to the profession and the community. Dr. Haraburda was the tenth engineer from Indiana to have received this honor. He was also one of nineteen engineers honored this year throughout the United States.

Dr. Haraburda served NSPE in several key positions, including as the Central Region Vice-Chair of the Professional Engineers in Government group and as Vice-President of the Francis Vigo chapter in Terre Haute, Indiana. As for community involvement, he served on the Board of Directors of the Terre Haute Children's Science and Technology Museum where he helped raise millions of dollars needed for construction of the new museum. As a retired US Army colonel with almost 30 years of service, he was named to the Hall of Fame at Central Michigan University for ROTC. Lieutenant General Jeffrey Talley, Commanding General of the Army Reserves, commented that, "awarding him Fellow Membership grade would be a tremendous asset to the future of professional engineering."

Harve Hnatiuk, PE, Vice-President of NSPE, presented a special recognition plaque and pin to Dr. Haraburda during the 2013 conference of the Indiana Society of Professional Engineers (ISPE) on June 14, 2013, in Indianapolis. He later installed Dr. Haraburda to the executive board of ISPE as its President-Elect for the 2013-2014 year. At this conference, Michael Fink, PE, a past-President of ISPE, presented a plaque to him recognizing him as the fifteenth Fellow of ISPE.

The NSPE is the national society of licensed professional engineers from all disciplines that promotes the ethical and competent practice of engineering, advocates licensure, and enhances the image and well-being of its members. Founded in 1934, NSPE serves more than 35,000 members and the public through 53 state and territorial societies and more than 400 chapters. The ISPE is the state society that supports Indiana.
